Do you know the drill?

Techniques and product offerings for this essential tool

A variety of factors need to be taken into consideration when drilling small holes in glass using a spear point or prismatic drill, and a variable-speed drill motor.

Before beginning to drill, check the condition of the work surface. It must be clean and flat. No abrasive grain should be on the surface. If the surface is warped or dirty, the glass can break under the pressure and weight of the drill motor.

Most glass fabrication tables are carpeted, and you must take precautions to make sure to not drill into the carpet. Drilling the carpet can ruin the glass. If the drill penetrates the glass suddenly and enters the carpet, all the coolant drains from the hole, the drill bit grabs the carpet and jerks the drill motor, and chips or “clams” appear in the glass.

To prevent, place a sheet of thin acrylic under the glass. The drill bit will not penetrate the acrylic and it will give a better feel for the completion of the hole. Wear safety glasses or a face shield when drilling glass.

The procedure for drilling small holes in glass using either a spear point or prismatic drill and a variable-speed drill motor is as follows:

1. Place the acrylic under the location of the hole.
2. Carefully mark the location of the center of the hole. The hole must be located exactly.
3. Tighten the drill bit in the chuck.
4. Place the point of the drill bit directly over the center of the hole and twist the chuck back and forth to scribe a center-mark for the drill bit. This ensures that the drill does not wander when you start operating it. It is the equivalent of center-punching a hole in metal.
5. Brush turpentine over the center of the hole to keep it bathed in coolant. A retaining ring may be used to keep the turpentine in the hole.
6. Start the drill motor with the drill bit touching the center scribe mark. Be mindful of the revolutions per minute, or RPM. Slowly squeeze the trigger of the drill. The weight of the drill motor itself is the only pressure required. Once the hole is started, rotate the drill motor clockwise to keep the bit from making the hole oblong and causing binding and/or cracking of the glass.
7. Drill until the drill bit just penetrates the glass. Too large a hole on the underside can result in binding and breaking out when the hole is completed from the other side.
8. Clean the surface of the glass thoroughly.
9. Lift the glass from the acrylic and clean it thoroughly.
10. Turn the glass over and place it on the acrylic. Re-apply turpentine to the area and carefully finish drilling the hole.

Machine drilling large holes

This section discusses the procedure for drilling a large hole in glass using a glass drilling machine equipped with a tube drill. For example, a tube drill is used to bore a 4-inch diamond hole in annealed glass.

Using a tube drill requires more equipment than drilling with drill bits. A retaining ring holds a mixture of coolant and abrasive grain. This mixture cuts and finishes the hole in one step. In order to keep the mixture from draining out suddenly when the end of the cut is reached, put a piece of duct tape on the surface of the glass opposite to where the hole is to be drilled. This tape also prevents the core of glass from becoming lodged in the shaft of the tube drill. This type of drilling should also be done over a piece of acrylic.

The procedure is as follows:

1. Put on your safety glasses or goggles.
2. Lay the glass on a piece of acrylic on a flat, clean surface.
3. Carefully lay out the location of the cut by establishing the centerline of the hole from two sides of the glass. To do this, mark a line from each edge of the glass that runs at right angles to the edge. The lines intersect like crosshairs in a rifle scope. This intersection is the centerline of the hole. For large holes, mark a square with sides the same length as the diameter of the tube drill. Use the L-square for accuracy.
4. Re-check your layout. Remember: measure twice, drill once.
5. Place duct tape on the reverse side of the glass. Be sure the tape covers the hole completely, especially if fabricating a mirror.
6. Choose the correct tube drill for the glass drilling machine. Insert the shank into the chuck. Tighten the chuck with the chuck key. The best way to tighten a drill chuck is to use the chuck key at every hole in the chuck.
- 7. With the chuck in a locked position, move the glass drilling machine to the area where the hole is to be drilled.**
8. Unlock the chuck and lower the tube to the glass. Be sure that the center of the drill lies directly over the center of the hole and is within the square.
9. Check the machine's depth gauge. The tube drill should just clear the thickness of the glass.
10. Re-check the positioning.
11. Raise and lock the chuck.
12. Set up the retaining ring or build a dam from putty.
13. Fill the dam about half full with a mixture of water and abrasive grit (carborundum) to achieve the desired smoothness. If using a diamond tube drill, use the special coolant.
14. If the glass drilling machine is variable-speed, set to the required RPM.
15. Turn on the machine and slowly lower the drill into the glass.
16. Don't force the drill into the glass. As the cut progresses, periodically lift the drill out of the hole to allow the mixture of coolant and/or abrasive grain to renew itself and cool the glass.
17. Be especially careful near the end of the cut. After the drill has penetrated the glass, raise the drill with the motor running and return it to the locked position.
18. Clean the glass with water by flooding with water or dabbing to remove all particles. Do not wipe; the grit on the glass will cause scratching.
