MAJORITY OF TCA ENDORSED CANDIDATES WIN.

The TCA PAC endorsed 32 candidates in State Legislative Primary races and came out with a 27-3-2 record, i.e., 27 won, 3 losses and 2 are facing runoffs. For the baseball fans out there, that compares with Sandy Koufax (Dodgers) in 1963 and Ron Guidry (Yankees) in 1978. Okay, baseball and politics don't compare.

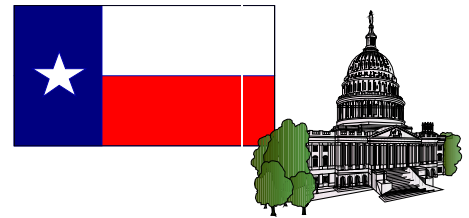
The winners in the State House included tort reforming Rep. Joe Nixon of Houston who won his Republican primary race by a 2 to 1 margin over a trial lawyer supported candidate. Also Rep. Allan Ritter of Beaumont, who is in the lumber business, won reelection over former State Senator David Bernsen. Rep. Tommy Merritt of Longview won reelection to the house. His family business produces insulation products for the building industry.

In the Senate, Kel Seliger (R-Amarillo) won an open seat in the Panhandle/Permian Basin region. He and his family own Lake Steel in Amarillo and sell steel. TCA was very active in supporting Senator Seliger. Senator Zaffirini (D-Laredo), Senator Gallegos (D-Houston) and Senator Van de Putte (D-San Antonio) all won primary races. Senator Seliger and Senator Van de Putte will also face general election opponents in the fall.

It was a tough night for five Democratic incumbent House members who were defeated in their primary. Incumbent House members who lost were Rep. Jaime Capelo (Corpus Christi), Rep. Miguel Wise (Weslaco), Rep. Timoteo Garza (Eagle Pass), Rep. Glenn Lewis (Fort Worth) and Rep. Ron Wilson (Houston). Two other Democratic House Members are in run-offs after finishing behind the frontrunner in their respective races, Rep. Roberto Gutierrez (McAllen) and Gabi Canales (Alice). No Republican incumbent lost in the Republican Primary.

CONGRESSIONAL RACES

With the recent Congressional redistricting there were several contested Congressional races. In the Dallas area, State Rep. Kenny Marchant of Carrollton won a Congressional seat formerly held by Congressman Martin Frost (Frost is running in CD 32 against Cong. Sessions in the fall). Marchant does not face an opponent in the fall. Cong. Ralph Hall of Rockwall, who recently switched from the Democratic Party to the Republican Party, easily won the Republican Primary nomination for CD 4.

In the Houston area, former State Judge Ted Poe received almost 60% of the vote to win over 5 opponents in the Republican primary. He will face Democratic Congressman Nick Lampson in the fall. Incumbent Democratic Congressman Chris Bell lost in the primary to former Judge Al Green (not the singer). In a new District that stretches from NW Houston to NE Austin, Ben Streusand of Houston will face Austin Mike McCaul in a runoff for the Republican nomination. The winner faces no opposition in the Fall.

In CD 25, which runs from Austin to the Valley, Congressman Lloyd Doggett won the Democratic nomination and Rebecca Armendariz/Klein

the Republican nomination. In CD 15, which runs from Bastrop to the Valley, Republicans Michael Thamm and Alexander Hamilton (not the original Alexander Hamilton) will meet in a runoff. Thamm is a plumbing contractor and serves on the Board of Plumbing Examiners. The winner will face Democratic incumbent Ruben Hinojosa of Weslaco in the fall. Congressman John Carter of Williamson County won reelection to CD 31.

In the Congressional seat that stretches from San Antonio to Laredo, Cong. Ciro Rodriguez of San Antonio beat Henry Cuellar of Laredo by 126 votes for the Democratic nomination for CD 28. Rodriguez will face either Francisco Canseco or James Hopson who are in a runoff for the Republican nomination.

Runoffs for State and Congressional Races are set for April 13.

Maryland to Study Glass Technician Licensure Act Further

In February, Maryland House of Representatives Delegate Mary Ann Love introduced House Bill 1097. This bill was based on the National Glass Association's Model Act for the Licensure of Auto Glass Technicians and Glaziers. Following a meeting with the Maryland Department of Licensing on March 3rd, Delegate Love reluctantly decided to hold her proposed legislation over for further study.

The delay stems from funding problems being experienced by the Maryland Department of Labor. In 2001, legislation was passed in Maryland requiring the licensure of several occupational specialties, including home inspectors. These programs have yet to be implemented due to funding shortages. It was concluded that auto glass and glazier licensing would suffer the same inaction if passed in 2004. Instead, Delegate Love decided to hold meetings this summer with Maryland regulators to seek a solution.

Tom Parbuoni and Brian Novak, of the Mid-Atlantic Glass Association, and Janice Brannon, NGA's Legislative Consultant, also met with Delegate Love and Gregory Safko, Commissioner, and Monica James, Counsel, of the Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing & Regulation, Division of Occupational Licensing and Regulation. The consensus emerging from that meeting was that Delegate Love's legislation had considerable merit and deserved to be pursued further.

To this end, Delegate Love will visit the Banner Glass location in her District to learn more about the complexities of the glass and glazing industries. Those visits will be followed by a meeting that Delegate Love wishes to hold with the Maryland Departments of Labor and Licensing with invitations also extended to major insurance companies, the Mid-Atlantic Glass Association and the NGA.

Ladies and Gentlemen...the NGA conducted its first State Government Committee conference call last Thursday to discuss progress being made on the introduction of the NGA's Model Licensing Act for Auto Glass Technicians & Glaziers. Representatives from 11 states participated.

Since licensure has never formally existed in our industry, questions arose as to how companies in other industries handle the training and licensing expenses when their state requires the licensing of certain occupational specialties. The bottom line being...is it the employee or the company who is responsible for these expenses? We researched a number of different trades in a number of different states. The answer, without exception, is the employee is the responsible party. That does not mean companies do not assist the employee in a variety of ways but the ultimate responsibility for qualifying to work in a trade belongs to the employee.

We also had questions about how much will it cost to train and license auto glass or glazing employees. As you will see from the attached memorandum, there is no single or absolute answer. Each state will license according to the same procedures it uses for all occupational licensing. It is also likely each state will be different.

Moreover, we have presented several options where individual companies or the NGA chapters could arrange "equivalent" training programs that could reduce the cost per student.

We hope the attached report will make it easier to understand the licensing process. As we've said several times, the State of Connecticut got the ball rolling toward glass industry technician licensure. Other states are now becoming aware of the Connecticut experience and rationale for glass technician licensure. It is unlikely that this momentum could be reversed even if we wanted to do so. At this point, it makes much better sense for us to be actively involved in the process than to have state bureaucrats – who know nothing of our industry – set licensing standards for us.

LICENSING OF GLASS TECHNICIANS

MODEL ACT

I. Legislative Intent:

The Legislature declares in order to protect the safety and welfare of the people of (state) against the unqualified and improper glass installation, maintenance and repair it is necessary to provide for the licensing and regulation of automotive glass replacement technicians, automotive glass repair technicians, and glaziers.

II. This shall be known as the Glass Technicians Licensure Act.

III. Definitions:

As used in this Act:

(1) Automotive glass work means installing, maintaining, or repairing fixed and/or moveable glass in motor vehicles.

(2) Glazing means installing, maintaining, or repairing glass in residential or commercial structures.

(3) "Board" means the Glass Technicians Board of Examiners (or other appropriate name)

(4) Licensed Automotive Glass Replacement Technician means a person licensed under this Act to provide automotive glass work.

(5) Licensed Automotive Glass Repair Technician means a person licensed under this Act to provide repairs to damaged fixed and/or moveable glass in motor vehicles.

(6) Licensed Glazier means a person licensed under this Act to provide glazing.

(7) Trainee means an unlicensed person working under the on-site supervision of a person licensed/certified in the applicable trade and as further set forth in rules.

(8) NGA means the National Glass Association.

(9) GITI means the Glass Installer Technical Institute developed by NGA.

(10) AGTI means the Auto Glass Technical Institute developed by NGA.

(11) AGRSS means the Auto Glass Replacement Safety Standard endorsed by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI).

IV. Glass Technicians Board of Examiners

A. There is hereby created the State Board of Glass Technicians established to administer this Act (chapter). This Board shall be composed of seven members who shall be residents of this State and appointed by the Governor. One member shall be a National Glass Association (NGA) certified auto glass replacement technician, one shall be a current owner or principal of a company engaged in the business of replacing auto glass, one member shall be NGA certified auto glass repair technician, one shall be a current owner or principal of a company engaged in the business of repairing auto glass, one member shall be a NGA certified glazier, one member shall be a current owner or principal of a company engaged in the business of glazing and one member shall be a representative of the public who is a consumer of glass work or has an interest in the rights of consumers.

B. Initial appointments to the Board shall be staggered such that two members are appointed for one year, two for two years and three for three years. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified, provided no member shall serve more than eight consecutive years or two consecutive terms whichever is greater.

C. Within 90 days after the effective date of the Act (Chapter), the Governor shall make initial appointments to the Board.

D. The initial members appointed under this subsection need not be licensed before (date) provided such initial members shall satisfy the applicable criteria for licensure on and after (date).

E. The Governor may, at the request of the Board, remove any member of the Board for misconduct, incompetence or neglect of duty.

V. The Board shall perform the following duties:

A. Evaluate the qualifications of applicants for licensure.

B. Provide for the national exam developed by the National Glass Association for auto glass replacement technicians, auto glass repair technicians and glaziers.

C. Register and issue licenses to those who qualify under this Act. (chapter)

D. Prescribe standards of ethical conduct for automotive glass work and glazing.

E. Adopt and revise rules necessary and appropriate, consistent with this Act. (chapter)

F. Establish and collect fines for violations of this Act. (chapter)

G. Meet at least (times a year) in compliance with the open meeting laws of this State. A majority of Board members shall constitute a quorum. The Board shall elect officers from its members and shall keep an official record of all its proceedings.

I. Establish and collect fees for sustaining the necessary operation of the Board.

VI. License Required

A. No person shall practice automotive glass work and/or glazing unless properly licensed in accordance with the provisions of this Act. (chapter).

B. No person shall use the titles Licensed Automotive Glass Replacement Technician, Licensed Automotive Glass Repair Technician or Licensed Glazier nor represent him or herself as a Licensed Automotive Glass Replacement Technician, Licensed Automotive Glass Repair Technician or a Licensed Glazier unless licensed in accordance with this Act (chapter).

C. All licenses are nontransferable.

VII. Qualifications for Licensure

A. To qualify for an Automotive Glass Replacement Technician License a person shall:

1. Be at least 18 years of age
2. Be of good moral character
3. Have completed the application process
4. Provide evidence of graduation from 8th grade grammar school or equivalent education
5. Have successfully completed the AGTI training program or an equivalent training program as determined by the Board.
6. Have worked as a trainee for a minimum of 6 months.
7. Have successfully passed the national exam developed by NGA for Automotive Glass Technicians
8. Have paid all required, nonrefundable fees

B. To qualify for an Automotive Glass Repair Technician License a person shall:

1. Be at least 18 years of age
2. Be of good moral character
3. Provide evidence of graduation from 8th grade grammar school or equivalent education
4. Have successfully completed a windshield repair manufacturers' factory training program or an equivalent training program as determined by the Board; or have worked as a trainee for a minimum of 6 months. All trainee candidates must have personally performed 200 or more auto glass repairs
5. Have successfully passed the national exam developed by NGA for Automotive Glass Repair Technicians
6. Have completed the application process
7. Have paid all required, nonrefundable fees

C. To qualify for a Glazier License a person shall:

1. Be at least 18 years of age
2. Be of good moral character
3. Provide evidence of graduation from an 8th grade grammar school or equivalent education
4. Have successfully completed the GITI program or an equivalent training program as determined by the Board
5. Have worked as a trainee for a minimum of 1 year
6. Have completed the application process
7. Have successfully passed the national exam developed by NGA for Glaziers
8. Have paid all required, nonrefundable fees

VIII. Examination

1. Applicant may take the appropriate licensure exam for auto glass replacement, auto glass repair work, or glazing, after the application process has been completed. The exam shall test entry level knowledge, including industry safety standards such as AGRSS and OSHA, as appropriate.
2. Exams shall be available on demand.
3. An applicant who fails the exam must wait 30 days before taking the exam again. If applicant fails a third time, he/she must wait 6 months to retake the exam. If applicant fails the third time, additional training and proof of program attendance is required prior to retaking the exam. The cost of re-testing is the same as the original exam.
4. Failure to appear for the exam on the scheduled date, time and place shall result in forfeiture of the exam fee.

IX. Transition Period

A. After (one year from the effective date of this law) no person shall provide automotive glass work or glazing or hold him or herself out as being able to provide automotive glass work or glazing unless licensed in accordance with this Act (chapter).

B. The Board shall issue a license without exam, during the transition period only, to an applicant that meets the following:

- (1) Any person who has practiced as an automotive glass replacement technician or auto glass repair technician full-time for 6 months or full-time for one year for glaziers prior to the effective date of this Act may be granted the appropriate license upon verification and completion of an investigation of the applicant's work history by the Board and payment of the required fee.
- (2) Prior to the completion of the transition period, all individuals qualifying under this section must have taken and passed the exam to retain their license.

X. Reciprocity

A. Any applicant who is Certified as an Auto Glass Technician or Auto Glass Repair Technician or Glazier by the National Glass Association and whose certification is current and in good standing may be granted the appropriate license, without examination, upon verification of their credentials by the Board and payment of the required fee.

B. Upon filing of an application and payment of the required fee, the Board may issue a license without examination to an applicant that is licensed as an auto glass replacement or auto glass repair technician or glazier in another state or territory provided that the requirements for licensure in that state or territory are substantially equal to the requirements for licensure in this State as determined by the Board.

XI. License Renewal

- A. An auto glass replacement technician license must be renewed after a three year period.
- B. An auto glass repair technician license must be renewed after a five year period.
- C. A glazier technician license must be renewed after a three year period.
- D. The Board shall set, by rule, the requirements for continuing education for each class of glass technician regulated by this Act.
- E. The Board shall set other license renewal requirements as needed.
- F. A licensee whose license has expired for more than 30 days but less than one year from the last day of renewal of license may renew license by paying a license renewal fee and a late penalty as established by the Board.
- G. If a license has lapsed more than 12 months and the applicant wishes to reenter the field, the individual must meet all the licensing requirements in effect at the time reinstatement is requested.

XII. Exemptions

A. This Act shall not be construed to prohibit:

- (1) Persons employed by any federal, state or municipal agency from the performance of the duties for which they have been properly trained.
- (2) A person who is a student in an educational, and/or certification program approved by the Board so long as the work product of that program is not intended for public use, or, if intended for public use, is undertaken under the supervision and approval of a licensed or certified instructor.
- (3) A NGA certified or licensed glass instructor from another state from performing automotive glass work or glazing in this state provided such services are part of a nationally approved training/educational program and are not performed more than (#) days per annum and so long as the work product of that training is not intended for public use.
- (4) Trainees from working under the on-site supervision of a person licensed/certified in the applicable trade.
- (5) Employees of industrial firms whose main duties concern the maintenance of automotive glass work or glazing on its own or leased premises for its own use and are not intended to be used in the public domain.
- (6) The fabrication of glass products.
- (7) Persons engaged in the installation, maintenance, repair and service of glass in and about single-family residences owned and occupied or to be occupied by such persons, subject to inspection and approval by the building official and in conformance with state building codes.
- (8) Persons or entities holding themselves out to be retail sellers of glass products but not such persons or entities that also engage in auto glass work or glazing.
- (9) Persons who install safety-backed mirror products or repair or replace flat glass in sizes not greater than 30 sq. feet in residential buildings.

XIII. Grounds for Disciplinary Action

The Board may revoke, suspend, refuse to renew, censure, fine or reprimand a licensee or place a licensee on probation for any of the following:

- (1) Practicing automotive glass work or glazing in violation of the provisions of this Act (chapter) or any rule adopted by the Board.
- (2) Obtaining or attempting to obtain a license by fraud or misrepresentation.
- (3) Having been convicted of a felony in the courts of this or any other state.
- (4) Gross negligence in the auto glass replacement, auto glass repair work or glazing that results in injury to another.
- (5) Engaging in dishonorable, unethical or unprofessional conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public.
- (6) Habitual intoxication or addiction to the use of drugs.
- (7) Directly or indirectly giving or receiving a fee, commission, rebate or other form of compensation for a service not actually rendered.
- (8) Failure to respond to a written request for information by the Board within 60 days.
- (9) Having had a license or certification revoked or suspended or other disciplinary action taken by authorities of another state or territory.
- (10) Aiding or abetting a person not licensed in this state who directly or indirectly performs auto glass replacement, auto glass repair work or glazing requiring a license.
- (11) Has made material misstatement in the application for licensure or renewal.

XIV. This Act (chapter) shall become effective (date or time period).
